We are delighted to announce the Japan-Latin America Academic Conference 2018 in Nikko, Japan, this fall. This is the fourth time that the University of Tokyo (UTokyo) organizes academic forum with our Chilean counterparts. The conference organizers are expecting major participation from Mexico, Brazil, Spain, and from the other parts of the world this time. The principal location of the conference will be in Nikko, Tochigi Prefecture, which is about two-and-half hours from Tokyo by train. Nikko is famous and popular for Nikko Toshogu Shrine, a world heritage site, and its beautiful sites nearby, such as Chuzenjiko Lake, Senjogahara Field, and Kegon Waterfall. Excursions to these sites will be planned. Most sessions will be held in Nikko, but early sessions will be organized in Tokyo. If you do not have sufficient time to attend the entire programs, please plan to attend the Nikko portion of the conference.

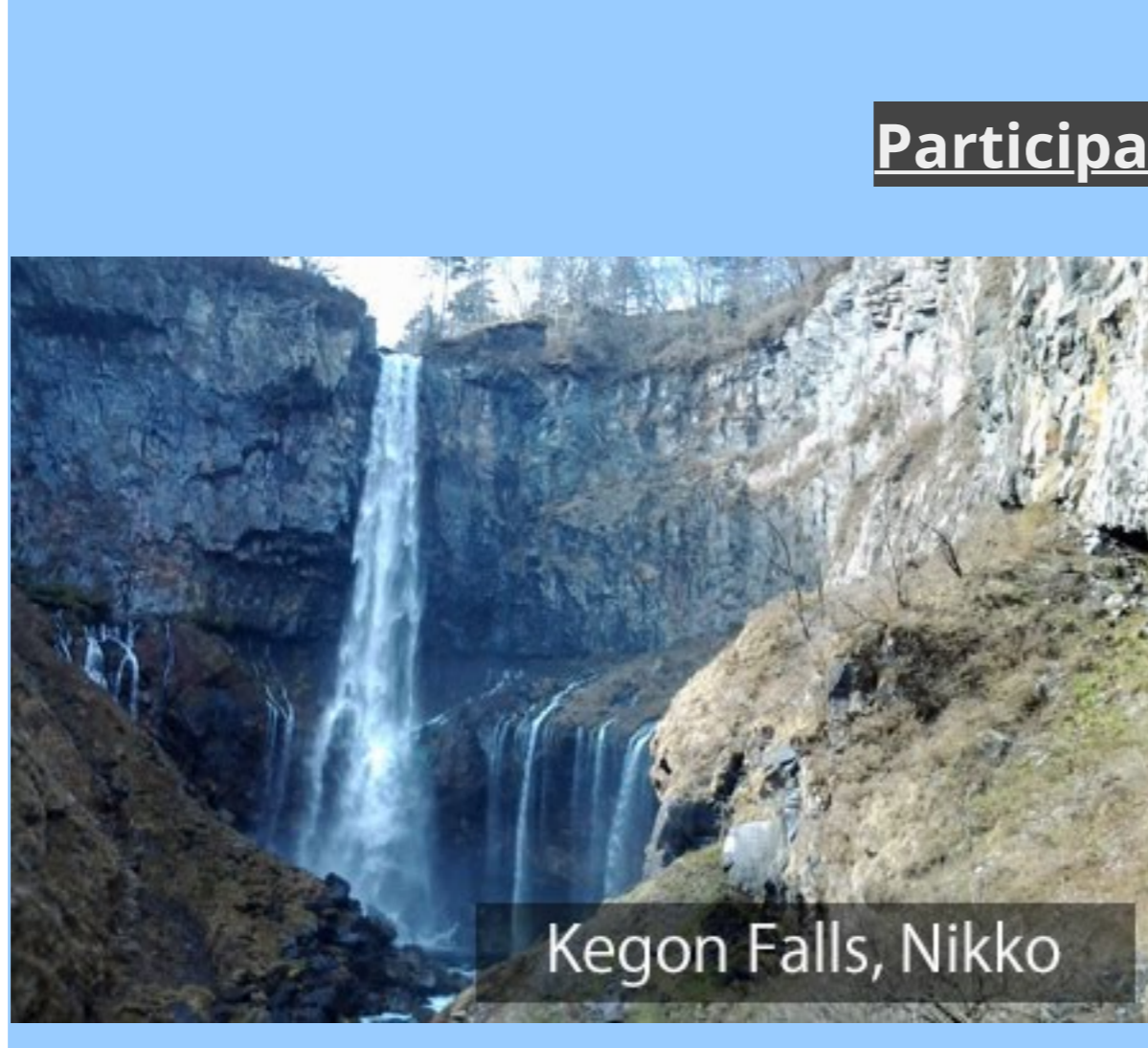

Financial Support

Following the format of the previous two forums (in 2014 and 2016), the participants should seek funding sources for their travel expenses. UTokyo LAINAC will make every effort to help offset the travel cost of the participants, and we are happy to be able to offer the following financial assistance to our colleagues and students:

1) JASSO grants for student participants:

We have obtained 13 student travel grants (80,000 yen) for those coming from abroad. Those who receive this grant are required to participate in the whole conference from September 21 to 28 and to serve as a ["LAINAC Friend"](#) to nurture the relationship between UTokyo and the recipient's own university. 2) LAINAC financial support for scholars:

LAINAC will cover accommodation expenses during the conference in Nikko for about 30 scholars including UTokyo students.
